#### **School Updates**

## **Covid-19 Reminders**

- Please do not send your child to school with any of the following symptoms: new or continuous cough; high temperature, or a loss of sense of taste or smell. Feel free to ring school for advice if you have any doubts.
- Please remain 2m apart from other parents when dropping off and collecting your children.
- We also ask that at peak times, and where it is difficult to remain at a 2m distance, parents and carers consider wearing a face covering.

### **Isolating**

- If anyone in your household needs a Covid test, the whole household must isolate. Children should only be in school once a negative result has been returned.
- Anyone testing positive should isolate for 10 days, and people living in the same household should isolate for 14 days, unless you are advised otherwise by Test and Trace.
- Please inform school if you need to borrow a laptop during isolation periods. We will endeavour to provide this where possible to support home learning.

### **Christmas Raffle**

Thank you to those of you who have already donated prizes for the Christmas Raffle. We had a fabulous Christmas Fair last year, and managed to raise enough money to buy class sets of ukuleles, and guitars. Hopefully, the money we raise from the raffle this year will also enable us to invest in some more new resources for school.
