### Sport and P.E next Half Term

Next half term we will be having a number of events organised by the School Sports Partnership. Reception will be learning about fundamental gymnastics; Year 1 children have a Pentathlon Challenge; Class 2 and Year 6 will be taught Invasion Games, and Classes 3 and 4 will be coached on Futsal. Year 6 pupils will also be completing another Playground Leader session, and they will be passing on what they have learnt to other year groups.

We do anticipate the weather being worse next half term, but clubs will take place outside on the MUGA wherever possible. Where this is not possible, we will use the Parish Hall.

As we only have access to the Parish Hall 2 nights a week, and do not have a viable alternative at the moment, we are limited in what we can offer for clubs. Unfortunately, there will be no sports club for Class 1, but Tea Club will still be available each night. Hopefully we will be able to offer more clubs after Christmas.

### Wrap- Around Care

Booking is open for Breakfast and Tea Club after half term up until Christmas. Timings will remain the same as this half term. At the moment we will also continue to limit numbers to 12 children from Classes 1 and 2, and 12 children from Classes 3 and 4. This will be kept under review, but we have been able to accommodate most requests to date. Breakfast Club is £3 including breakfast, or £1.50 after 8.10 without breakfast. The cost of tea club is £3 for the first hour and then an additional £1 for every ½ hour after. While we tend to give 2 minutes leeway for entering into the next time slot, please understand our income from this is limited and we need to stick to these times.
