PSHCE

<u>Intent</u>

At Esh C of E (Aided) Primary School, our PSHCE curriculum is accessible to all and will maximise the outcomes for every child so that they know more, remember more and understand more. <u>Intent</u>

At Esh C of E (Aided) Primary School, we want all our children to grow up healthy, happy, safe, and able to manage the challenges and opportunities of modern Britain. Our Relationship and Sex education curriculum is designed to equip our children with knowledge to make informed decisions about their wellbeing, health and relationships as well as preparing them for a successful adult life. Our Relationships Education will put in place the building blocks needed for positive and safe relationships, including with family, friends and online. Our children will be taught what a relationship is, what friendship is, what family means and who can support them. In an age-appropriate way, we will cover how to treat each other with kindness, consideration and respect.

PSHE Research

PSHE Association evaluated research 'Effective Prevent education' in partnership with Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre (CEOP), outlines 11 key principles of effective practice in prevention education and the positive impact of these been addressed in school.

Implementation

Impact

At Esh C of E (Aided) Primary School, we deliver the curriculum by utilising first-hand experience and sharing good practice. However, we are aware that the delivered curriculum must reflect the needs of our pupils. We expect teachers to use a PSHE programme to equip pupils with a sound understanding of risk and with the knowledge and skills necessary to make safe and informed decisions. We believe that the purpose of PSHE education is to build where appropriate, on the statutory content already outlined in the national curriculum, the basic school curriculum and in statutory guidance on: for example, drug education, financial education, citizenship, personal safety, relationship and sex education and the importance of physical activity and diet for a healthy lifestyle. PSHE is integral to the development of children values in order for them to become a positive citizen in a forever changing community.
