

Areas of Study this Term

English— English genres we will be exploring during summer term are narratives, persuasive adverts, non-chronological reports and poetry.

Maths— Summer term will see us covering topics such as time, decimals, money, shape and statistics. We will also continue with arithmetic practice using all four operations.

RE - Our RE focus this summer term will be to answer the question 'What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today?'

Science— In science this half term we will be exploring the topic of Plants. We will also be carrying out a STEM project focused on inventors and scientists.

Humanities — This half term we will focus on the Vikings in history. In Geography, we will be exploring fair trade by focusing on the question 'Why does it matter where our food comes from?'

Computing— This term of computing we will be learning about microbits. In our digital literacy sessions we will be focusing on 'Strong or Wrong?', sharing information, making payments online and online persona scenarios.

Art & DT — Our art topic this half term will focus on drawing and illustrations. Our DT topic is cooking Bolognaise where children will learn cutting skills, ingredient adaptations and food hygiene and safety.

French—Our French topics this term are 'I am able to...' and 'Vegetables'.

PSHE—This term we will be focusing on 'growing up—health and wellbeing' and 'VIP's—relationships'.
